March 21, 2016

The Wilmore City Council met in regular session Monday, March 21, 2016 at 6:00 p.m. at Wilmore City Hall with Mayor Harold Rainwater presiding. Councilmembers present were: Jeff Baier, Jim Brumfield, Lynn Cooper, Kim Deyer, Leonard Fitch and Jeff James. City Attorney Robert L. Gullette III was present.

Pledge to the American flag.


The council agreed to use the \$2500 from the sale of the bucket truck to buy a used water truck to water the flower baskets.
