

CITY OF WILMORE MINUTES
APRIL 16, 2018

The Wilmore City Council met in regular session Monday, April 16, 2018 at 6:00 p.m. at Wilmore City Hall with Mayor Harold Rainwater presiding. Councilmembers present were: Jim Brumfield, Kim Deyer, Lynn Cooper, Leonard Fitch and David Riel. City Attorney Robert L. Gullette III was present.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Councilmember Deyer moved to approve the minutes of the March 19, 2018 regular meeting; seconded by Councilmember Brumfield. There being no discussion, all members voted aye.

OLD BUSINESS

CABLE FRANCHISE

Attorney Gullette spoke to the Council about the City's cable franchise with Charter Communications. Lori Vahle stated that after receiving the numbers it is not necessary to do our own franchise since we will be getting more from the state based on the estimated revenue from Charter Communications.

RECREATIONAL PARKED VEHICLES

Attorney Gullette stated that the committee met and he is waiting on the ordinances that he has requested from the City of Nicholasville.

NEW BUSINESS

Mayor Rainwater asked the council to make new business agenda items 1, 2, 3 & 4 action items by suspending the rules.

Councilmember Brumfield made the motion, seconded by Councilmember Deyer to suspend the rules to take action on items 1, 2, 3, & 4. There being no discussion, all members voted aye.

SURPLUS 2003 GMC PICKUP AND 2000 FORD F750 DUMPTRUCK WITH WESTERN SNOW PLOW AND SALT SPREADER

Councilmember Brumfield made the motion, seconded by Councilmember Deyer to authorize Dave Carlstedt to surplus the 2003 GMC Pickup with a minimum of \$200.00 and the 2000 Ford F750 Dump truck with a minimum of \$5000.00. There being no discussion, all members voted aye.

REAPPOINTMENT OF PETER BEATY FOR PLANNING & ZONING

Councilmember Deyer made the motion, seconded by Councilmember Cooper to reappoint Peter Beaty to Planning and Zoning. There being no discussion, all members voted aye.

ASBURY SEMINARY FEDERAL WORK STUDY FUND AGREEMENT

Councilmember Fitch made the motion, seconded by Councilmember Riel to authorize the Mayor to sign the agreement with the Seminary for the work study funds. There being no discussion, all members voted aye.

ATTORNEY GULLETTE'S COMMENTS:

Attorney Gullette presented a check of \$13,784.17 to the city for delinquent property taxes that he has collected.

COUNCIL MEMBER COMMENTS:

Councilmember Brumfield received an email from a citizen asking that we not let political signs be posted until 30 days before an election. Attorney Gulette stated that content based regulations on speech which includes signage would have to adhere to “strict scrutiny” by the Supreme Court and they will unanimously shut that down.

Councilmember Cooper received a request from a citizen asking the city to increase traffic speed control near Adventure Serve during elementary school times.


