CITY OF WILMORE MINUTES December 5, 2016

The Wilmore City Council met in regular session Monday, December 5, 2016 at 6:00 p.m. at Wilmore City Hall with Mayor Harold Rainwater presiding. Councilmembers present were: Jeff Baier, Jim Brumfield, Lynn Cooper, Kim Deyer, Leonard Fitch and Jeff James. City Attorney Robert L. Gullette III was present. Not present:

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Councilmember James moved to approve the minutes of the November 21, 2016 regular meeting; seconded by Councilmember Cooper. There being no discussion, all members voted aye.

OLD BUSINESS;

ROSEGLADE FARM AND CONSERVATION EASEMENT

Attorney Bruce Simpson presented the council with a Proposal for Binding Commitments. These commitments include a landscaping plan, which includes a 200' buffer along Harrodsburg Road and Lexington Road, a continuous horse style plank fence, a continuous landscape screen with a mix of large trees, an additional screening around detention basins, and two trees shall be in the rear yards of each residential lot whose backyard faces Road 29 or U.S. 68. They will also incorporate a Homeowners Association that is approved by the Kentucky Secretary of State. The HOA will be responsible for the care and maintenance of all common areas identified on Exhibit A. Each residential unit to be constructed shall have at least 1,600 square feet of living space, exclusive of the garage and each unit shall have a two car attached garage.

Mayor Rainwater asked them to provide a sample of a HOA that would work and any history of switching a conservation easement and any challenges to that and how that has been handled.

ORDINANCE 696-16 ZONE MAP AMENDMENT FOR FORBES PROPERTY (SECOND READING):

Councilmember Brumfield made the motion, seconded by Councilmember Deyer to approve Ordinance 696-16 AN ORDINANCE CHANGING THE ZONE FROM AN AGRICULTURAL (A-1) ZONE TO A SINGLE FAMILY RESIDENTIAL (R-1) ZONE FOR .92 NET ACRES FOR PROPERTY LOCATED AT 200 MURPHY LANE. There being no discussion, Ordinance 696-16 passed on second reading by voice vote with all members present voting aye.

ORDINANCE 695-16 ZONE MAP AMENDMENT FOR LEGACY POINT (SECOND READING)

Councilmember Baier made the motion, seconded by Councilmember Brumfield to accept the Findings of Facts and Justification prepared by City Attorney Gullette related to the Legacy Point ZMA and to approve Ordinance 695-16 AN ORDINANCE CHANGING THE ZONE FROM AN

AGRICULTURAL (A-1) ZONE TO A SINGLE FAMILY RESIDENTIAL (R-1) ZONE, FOR 52.57 NET ACRES; FROM AGRICULTURAL (A-1) ZONE TO RESIDENTIAL (R-1T) ZONE, FOR 15.34 NET ACRES; FROM SINGLE FAMILY RESIDENTIAL (R-1) ZONE TO AGRICULTURAL (A-1) ZONE, FOR 102.27 NET ACRES; FROM RESIDENTIAL (R-1T) ZONE TO AGRICULTURAL ZONE (A-1) ZONE, FOR 14.54 NET ACRES; FROM RESIDENTIAL (R-1T) ZONE TO SINGLE FAMILY ZONE (R-1) ZONE FOR 20.98 NET ACRES; AND FROM SINGLE FAMILY RESIDENTIAL (R-1) ZONE TO RESIDENTIAL (R-1T) ZONE FOR 25.80 NET ACRES, FOR PROPERTY LOCATED AT NORTHWEST CORNER OF US-68 AND MURPHY'S LANE.
