

CITY OF WILMORE MINUTES
October 17, 2016

The Wilmore City Council met in regular session Monday, October 17, 2016 at 6:00 p.m. at Wilmore City Hall with Mayor Harold Rainwater presiding. Councilmembers present were: Jeff Baier, Jim Brumfield, Lynn Cooper, Kim Deyer, Leonard Fitch and Jeff James. City Attorney Robert L. Gullette III was present.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Councilmember Brumfield moved to approve the minutes of the October 3, 2016 regular meeting; seconded by Councilmember Baier. There being no discussion, all members voted aye.

OLD BUSINESS:

Councilmember Brumfield made a motion, seconded by Councilmember Deyer to approve the Second Reading of the Real Property 2016 Tax Rate using the compensating property tax rate on real property which is 0.002230. There being no discussion, all members voted aye.

Councilmember Brumfield made a motion, seconded by Councilmember Deyer to approve the Second Reading of the Tangible Property 2016 Tax Rate using the same property tax rate on tangible property as last year which is 0.007481. There being no discussion, all members voted aye.

Councilmember James made a motion, seconded by Councilmember Deyer to approve the First Reading of Ordinance 692-16 ENACTING AS AN ORDINANCE, A CODE OF ORDINANCES FOR THE CITY OF WILMORE, REVISING, AMENDING, RESTATING, CODIFYING, AND COMPILING CERTAIN EXISTING GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE CITY DEALING WITH SUBJECTS EMBRACED IN THE CODE. There being no discussion, all members voted aye.
